Good Academic Progress:	
The Graduate School considers progress toward the MA degree to be minimally satisfactory when progress is made at a	
rate that will allow a student to complete the degree within four consecutive terms of full-time study, students in that	
program must complete the degree within eight consecutive terms of full-time study. Students will be evaluated annually	
to ensure that they are progressing at a pace that will allow them to complete their degree within the maximum time frame.	
This evaluation will be based on the number of credits that a student has completed of those attempted.	
Students must also maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0. The cumulative GPA is derived	
from all courses in which a student has registered and received a grade. Students may not hold more than one mark	
of <u>Incomplete</u> at a time.	
Master's students in the programs listed below may, over a four-year period, pursue a program of part-time study leading	
to the MA degree. The half and quarter <u>Residence Units</u> are designed to accommodate part-time students in these	
programs. Students enrolled in these programs may register for half and quarter Residence Unit registration categories
